The Eternal Heaven



What do I need to know about the Topic?

The present world, marred by sin and corruption, is temporary and will one day pass away. Jesus declared in Matthew 24:35, “Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.” At the end of Christ’s millennial reign and following the Great White Throne Judgment, God will bring about the complete renewal of the heavens and the earth (2 Peter 3:10).

In their place, God will create a new heaven and a new earth, far more glorious than anything of this present world (Revelation 21:1-2). This eternal creation will be free from pain, sorrow, death, and sin. It will be the permanent home of the redeemed, where God Himself will dwell among His people. Revelation 21:3-4 promises, “He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.”

Jesus comforted His disciples with this hope, saying in John 14:2-3, “In my Father’s house are many mansions...I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also.” Heaven is therefore not a vague dream but a prepared place for a prepared people.

For young believers and students, understanding the doctrine of heaven provides hope and motivation. It reminds them that this present life, with its trials and struggles, is not the end. The Christian journey leads toward a perfect and eternal future with Christ, inspiring perseverance, faithfulness, and joy in serving the Lord.

What is the Big Idea?



The goal of this lesson is to help believers understand heaven as the eternal, glorious home God has prepared for His people and the source of hope for living faithfully now.

At the end of the lesson, everyone should:

- Recognize that the present world is temporary and will be replaced by a new heaven and new earth.
- Understand that heaven is God’s prepared dwelling for the redeemed, free from sorrow, death, and sin.
- Appreciate the hope and motivation this eternal home provides for faithful living.
- Commit to living with eternity in mind, persevering in faith and service to God.

Discussing the Passage: Revelation 21:1-4

God promises a new heaven and new earth where He will dwell with His people. There will be no more sorrow or death, and every tear will be wiped away. This passage assures believers of God's ultimate plan and eternal reward.



Exploring the Passage

- What is the Eternal Heaven? The glorified, everlasting home God has prepared for His people (Revelation 21:1-4; John 14:2-3).
- Why is it important? It provides hope, comfort, and motivation to persevere in faith (Matthew 24:35; Revelation 22:3-5).
- What does it do for us? Encourages holy living, strengthens faith, and inspires endurance through trials (John 14:2-3; Revelation 21:4).

Assignment

Reflect on how the hope of eternal heaven affects your perspective on daily life. Write down one practical way this hope can change your choices, supported by a scripture verse.

- How does understanding heaven shape your priorities and decisions today?
